As the clergy and servers enter church, we stand to sing the first hymn

Morning has broken like the first morning; blackbird has spoken like the first bird.
Praise for the singing, Praise for the morning, Praise for them springing Fresh from the Word.

Sweet the rain's new fall sunlit from heaven, like the first dewfall on the first grass. Praise for the sweetness of the wet garden, sprung in completeness where his feet pass.

Mine is the sunlight, mine is the morning, born of the one light Eden saw play.

Praise with elation, praise every morning, God's recreation of the new day.

Entrance antiphon

You are just, O Lord, and your judgement is right; treat your servant in accord with your merciful love.

Greeting and confession

In the name of the → Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit:

ALL: Amen

The Lord be with you and also with you.

The priest welcomes everyone to St Laurence's and introduces the theme of the service.

We are invited to call to mind whatever we have done wrong in the sight of God.

After a moment of silence:

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned against you and against each other in thought and word and deed, through negligence, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault. We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins.

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past and grant that we may serve you in newness of life to the glory of your name. Amen.

Almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Our sins forgiven, we sing the song of the angels:

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth.

Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.


Please remain standing while the priest prays the opening prayer:

After the Gospel, please be seated for the sermon.

Afterwards, everyone stands for the creed We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit

and the Virgin Mary

and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son

is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism

for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

We all sit or kneel for the prayers.

The offertory

The prayer over the gifts

O God, who give us the gift of true prayer and of peace, graciously grant that, through this offering, we may do fitting homage to your divine majesty and, by partaking of the sacred mystery, we may be faithfully united in mind and heart Through Christ our Lord Amen

The priest invites the people to join in the eucharistic celebration, the Great Thanksgiving:

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

The Lord be with you and also with you.

Lift up your hearts

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God It is right to give thanks and praise.

Father, we give you thanks and praise through your beloved Son Jesus Christ, your living Word, through whom you have created all things; who was sent by you in your great goodness to be our Saviour.

By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh; as your Son, born of the blessed Virgin, he lived on earth and went about among us; he opened wide his arms for us on the cross; he put an end to death by dying for us;

and revealed the resurrection by rising to new life; so he fulfilled your will and won for you a holy people.

Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name,

for ever praising you and saying:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord
God of power and might;
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness; grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit, and according to your holy will, these gifts of bread and wine may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: *Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.*

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying:

Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died:

Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world;

rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension,

and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise & thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of Laurence and all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord;

by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever Amen.



Remaining standing, we sing together the Lord's prayer:

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray:

Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power,
and the glory are yours
now and for ever.
Amen.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

Please kneel. While the bread is broken, we sing: Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: have mercy on us.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed.

The priest will say to all: The body of Christ and everyone who intends to receive communion replies together: *Amen*.

All who are prepared and are accustomed to receiving holy communion are invited to join with us this morning. Please follow the guidance of the churchwardens, who will invite you to the front of the church to receive if you wish.

Please receive the host standing. Reception of the Chalice is optional. If you wish to receive the Blood of Christ, please drink directly from the Cup. If you choose not receive the chalice, please pause to acknowledge the Blood of Christ (e.g. by a slight bow).

During communion, the choir will sing an anthem, and then all join in the communion hymn(s).
